

Health and Safety Policy Statement

It is the policy of this Company that its operations are executed at all times and in such a way as to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and welfare of all its employees and all persons likely to be affected by its operations, including sub-contractors, self employed and members of the public. This document therefore applies to everyone engaged or contracted by this company.

The company will, so far as is reasonably practicable provide a safe working environment and keep in safe and sound repair all tools, plant, equipment and protective clothing. Regular checks will be carried out and defective equipment will be replaced and repaired.

The company will keep up to date and comply with all health and safety legislation relevant to its activities and fulfil its obligations under the Health and Safety at Work (NI) Order 1978 and the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974. Whilst company operations take place in the Republic of Ireland, the company will keep up to date and comply with all health and safety legislation relevant to its activities, in particular the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Construction) Regulations and the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act.

The Company wishes to draw the attention of everyone concerned to their duty under the Order to take all reasonable care for the Health and Safety of themselves and all others who may be affected by their acts, or omissions at work. This applies to all who are employed, engaged or contracted by this Company.

Managers and supervisors with direct responsibility for the Company's sites and premises are expected to personally conduct frequent safety audits covering working practices and equipment.

Managers and supervisors, supported by the Quality, Health, Safety and Environmental (QHSE) manager and safety representatives, shall explain the Company's Health & Safety Policy to their staff, gain their commitment to it and involve them in its implementation. Employees will be consulted on health and safety matters and will be involved in the formulation of health and safety procedure.

All company vehicles must be used in accordance with the rules, regulations and guidelines as referred to in the "Fleet Drivers Handbook" which has been issued to all drivers. Company progress in health and safety will be monitored. Accident and incident statistics will be reviewed and accidents investigated in a formal manner.

We are committed to promoting, and seek to continually improve health and safety within our organisation and are committed to providing and maintaining adequate financial and physical resources to implement this.

The Managing Director (Mr Eoin McCann) is the Director ultimately responsible for health and safety. This Policy will be reviewed on a regular basis to ensure its relevance and application to activities carried out on the premises and at construction sites. In support of this the policy will be reviewed at least annually.
